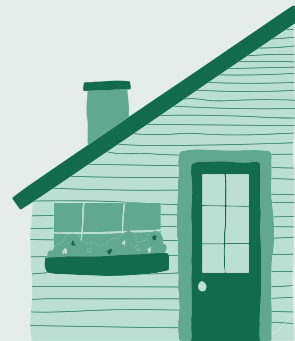
The City of Auburn Community Services Department has used Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding to **help more than 6,126 Auburn residents** so far, with more funding to come.



SENIOR CITIZEN SERVICES

\$7,033

We supported the Lee-Russell Council of Governments' Senior Center housed at the Boykin Community Center, which has cared for one of our most vulnerable populations throughout the pandemic.



\$147,881 FOR HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION

We helped 549 people stay in their homes and navigate losing their homes by providing utility, mortgage and rental assistance and connecting them with local agencies who can help provide shelter.

IMPACTED 361 YOUTH



\$90,000 went to agencies that support Auburn's youth like the Boys and Girls Clubs of Greater Lee County and Joyland Child Development Center.

PROVIDING FOR AND SUPPORTING FAMILIES

More than 136 families have received support through \$55,000 that has gone to agencies like the Family Resource Center, the Domestic Violence Intervention Center and Esperanza House.



FEEDING THE HUNGRY

\$397,060 has gone to the Food Bank of East Alabama and the Auburn Community Development Corporation to feed the food insecure in our area through local nonprofits and the Boykin Community Center Food Pantry.



MORE \$\$ TO COME

The City has applied for another round of funding that is expected to total \$750,000, allowing us to lend even more help to our community.
